

## **PARTICIPATORY BUDGETING PROJECTS FOR 2017**

Over the past several years, the Merced Extension Triangle Neighborhood Association (METNA) has sponsored several quality of life improvement projects under District 7 Supervisor Norman Yee's Participatory Budgeting.

Two early Pedestrian Safety Vision Zero Projects were funded for Interactive Radar Speed Signs on Alemany Blvd., near Victoria. A pedestrian sidewalk was placed along the north side of Brotherhood Way from Thomas Moore to St. Charles Ave. and more recently lights were placed in the Brotherhood Way underpass at Junipero Serra Blvd.

For 2017, two more projects endorsed by METNA, will be funded by Participatory Budgeting in District 7. The Merced Extension Triangle Community Connectors program will be fully funded to start a senior program for neighborhood residents.
